


Droichead: Exploring and Eliciting Perspectives, Experiences and Narratives

Induction can bring together all who have an interest in teacher quality (Bartell, 2005). This MIE/TCD consortium brings together the shared knowledge and expertise of two institutions who have long histories in Initial Teacher Education at both primary and post-primary level, documented excellence in research in education nationally and internationally and a shared vision for a quality continuum of education in Ireland.

The researchers will use a Case Study approach as the overarching research methodology in this research. In summary, this will involve the use of *online questionnaires* to construct an overall profile of the Newly Qualified Teachers (NQTs), Professional Support Team (PST) personnel and Whole School personnel. The data from the online questionnaires will also be used to form the sub-samples for the *NQT focus groups*, the *PST focus groups*, the *Whole School focus groups* and researcher – and participant-generated *visual diaries*.
