

Vulnerable Persons – Risk Assessment

In developing our <u>Safeguarding Policy: Vulnerable Persons</u> in line with requirements under the <u>Children First Act 2015</u>, <u>Children First: National Guidance for the Protection and Welfare</u> of <u>Children (2017)</u> and the HSE's <u>Safeguarding Vulnerable Persons at Risk of Abuse: National</u> <u>Policy and Procedures (2014)</u>, we have carried out an assessment of any potential for harm* to a vulnerable person on the campus of Marino Institute of Education (MIE) campus or when engaged in activities with staff of MIE. Below is a list of the areas of risk identified and the list of procedures for managing these risks.

*Note – these are risks associated with abuse as defined under the <u>Children First Act 2015</u> and are not risks to general health and safety.
