## Terms and Conditions of Being a Registered Student in MIE

#### 1. Context

In order to complete the registration process annually, all students are required to agree to the terms and conditions in this document. In order to begin or continue studies in MIE, you, as a registered student, must accept and agree to be bound by the MIE terms and conditions and MIE policies and procedures that apply to students.

### 2. Purpose

This document sets out the MIE terms and conditions for students registering to one of the following MIE undergraduate or postgraduate programmes;

- i. Trinity International Foundation Programme
- ii. Bachelor in Education (Primary)
- iii. Baitsiléir san Oideachas Trí Mheán na Gaeilge (Bunmhúinteoireacht)
- iv. Bachelor in Science (Education Studies; Early Childhood Education)
- v. Professional Master of Education (Primary)
- vi. Professional Diploma in Education (Further Education)
- vii. Master in Education Studies (Early Childhood Education; Intercultural Learning and Leadership; Visual Arts; Inquiry-Based Learning; Primary Mathematics Education; Christian School Leadership, Further Education)

#### 3. Terms and Conditions – Data Collection Information

3.1. Personal data collected on registration is collected for the provision of education, student support services and for related administrative and record-keeping purposes<sup>1</sup>. All personal data collected and processed will be in accordance with the <u>Data Protection Acts 1988-2018</u>, and the EU <u>General Data Protection Legislation (GDPR) 2018</u> and as further outlined in the <u>MIE Privacy Statement</u>. The following are some of the ways that MIE may use your data.

- 3.2. Selected data will be provided to relevant bodies where there is a statutory obligation on MIE to do so, such as to the <u>Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection</u>. Information which is not personally identifiable will be provided for statistical purposes to government, to members of the public under <u>Freedom of Information</u>, or other bodies. If appropriate, identifiable information will be provided to grant or sponsoring bodies, such as <u>Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI)</u>, regarding attendance and/or academic performance where this is relevant.
- 3.3. Personal data collected from international students outside the European Economic Area may be shared with the <u>Department of Justice and Equality</u> as required under <u>section 8</u> of the <u>Immigration Act</u>, 2003 in order to validate and progress visa applications.
- 3.4. I acknowledge that personal data, for statistical purposes, is collected on the disability, social, economic and cultural background of students entering MIE this year, for the purpose of tracking the diversity of the MIE student population and that it is not mandatory to answer these particular questions and non-response will not affect me in any way.
- 3.5. All relevant information will be retained for a specified period in accordance with the MIE Record Management Policy and MIE Records Retention Schedule.
- 3.6. By continuing with my registration, I acknowledge that my data will be shared with the Higher Education Authority (HEA) for funding allocation, statistical analysis and policy formulation purposes. The data shared includes personal data such as name, address, Eircode, personal public service number (PPSN), grant status, and Central Applications Office (CAO) data. Full details of what data are shared and how these data are used are contained at this link: www.mie.ie/hea data collection.
- 3.7. Personal data will be shared with the National Vetting Bureau where a student is registered on a course that requires garda vetting to be carried out.
- 3.8. I acknowledge that registration on my MIE course is contingent on successful Garda vetting,<sup>2</sup> where relevant. I authorise MIE to release to schools/other institutions in which I undertake school placement/work placement/field placement/special education placement a confidential copy of my Garda vetting results should the school request same.

- 3.9. I acknowledge that MIE will provide my personal data to external service providers engaged by MIE in order to facilitate the provision of the relevant student support service (e.g. <u>Disability Service</u> and <u>Health Service</u>).
- 3.10. I acknowledge that MIE will, where relevant, provide the <u>Teaching Council and</u>

  <u>Department of Education and Skills</u> with the details necessary to commence my registration and eligibility for induction as a teacher.
- 3.11. I acknowledge that details of degree results matched with student data (including student name, student number, contact details, personal public service number (PPSN)), nationality and date of birth) are shared with <u>Academic Registry</u> in Trinity College Dublin, the University of Dublin for the purposes of issuing student numbers and making academic awards.
- 3.12. Students' registered names and the type and grade (where appropriate) of award are publicly acknowledged at conferring or other awards ceremonies. MIE may also include your name and course in graduation booklets and these may be printed and circulated to attendees at graduation celebrations.
- 3.13. Personal data will not be processed, other than as required or permitted by law. Those providing personal data have the right to access and rectify such data, within parameters set in law. Personal data will be processed by MIE in accordance with the <a href="Data Protection">Data Protection</a>
  Act, 2018, GDPR, 2018 and the MIE Privacy Statement.
- 3.14. I am aware that the Privacy Statement for Blended Learning has been amended to include recording and live streaming of some classes. I have read this document and accept its contents.
- 3.15. I understand that, during my studies, I will be invited to participate in <a href="StudentSurvey.ie">StudentSurvey.ie</a>.

  Some of my information will be sent to the <a href="HEA">HEA</a> to ensure that the survey is offered only to intended groups of students. Certain limited demographic information may be matched to my survey responses in order to allow for anonymised analysis of results, for example, by gender or full-time/part-time status. My responses will be treated confidentially, and no individual student will be identifiable in any reports or results generated as a result of this survey.
- 3.16. I confirm that I have accessed online a copy of the <u>Institute Charges Policy</u> and I hereby apply for registration in accordance with its provisions.



- 3.17. I certify that all fees and charges due to MIE have been paid by me or will be paid by me or on my behalf as instructed by the <u>Finance Office</u>, in accordance with the <u>Institute</u> <u>Charges Policy</u>. I acknowledge that penalties and sanctions will be applied in accordance with the <u>Institute Charges Policy</u> in the event that I fail to comply with this undertaking.
- 3.18. I understand that MIE may contact grant or sponsoring bodies to ascertain or verify the status of my grant application.
- 3.19. I understand that my contact details may be used for all student and alumni purposes in accordance with the MIE Privacy Statement.
- 3.20. I acknowledge that it may be necessary to disclose to parents or guardians claiming benefit in respect to their children (e.g., child benefit of child dependent allowance) the registration status of the student concerned, as required under section 238/1 of S.I. No. 142/2002 – Social Welfare (Consolidated Claims, Payments and Control) Regulations 2007.
- 3.21. In the context of my educational programme at MIE, I am aware that lectures, seminars, tutorials and other events may take place remotely (using a webinar or other similar format) or physically, and that such lectures, seminars, tutorials and other MIE events may be recorded and such recordings may be retained for future educational uses.
- 3.22. I understand that where my course requires school, work or field placement, I shall act responsibly at all times. This includes respecting the privacy of those I engage with in this work and not sharing images, videos or text about any aspect of placement on social media or elsewhere. I further confirm that I shall not engage in any way on social media platforms with students, staff or others who I meet through participation in a placement.
- 3.23. I acknowledge, where relevant, that my course is a full-time course and that I am required to attend classes as timetabled.
- 3.24. I understand that in emergency situations (e.g. late cancellation of a class), I may receive a text message with information from MIE.
- 3.25. I understand that MIE uses the software SeAts to record attendance for students on the International Foundation Programme and the Bachelor in Science (Early Childhood Education) programme. In order for this application to be used, MIE shares with SeAts your name, your MIE email address, your course title and the modules that you are taking. This data is processed in line with MIE's data sharing agreement with SeAts.



3.26. By using MIE library services, students agree to comply with the Marino Institute of Education Library's terms of use and privacy notice, which outlines the collection, use, and processing of personal data.
